

**Softwood Lumber from Canada:  
Reminder – Invoices for Current Imports No Longer Subject to ADD/CVD  
Should Not Indicate ADD/CVD Duties Included in Invoice Price**

This is a reminder that invoices presented to CBP for clearance and entry of current softwood lumber imports from Canada that are no longer subject to antidumping and/or countervailing duty deposit requirements should not indicate that ADD/CVD deposit amounts are included in the invoice price.

The ADD/CVD deposit requirements on softwood lumber from Canada were removed on October 12, 2006 pursuant to the Canada-United States Softwood Lumber Agreement of 2006. Current importations of this merchandise are therefore not subject to ADD/CVD requirements, and no deduction can be made from the invoice value for ADD/CVD deposits in arriving at the entered value that is declared to CBP on the entry summary.

We have noticed a number of instances in which invoices presented for shipments of softwood lumber from Canada imported after October 12 indicate that ADD/CVD deposit amounts are included in the sale price. Any statements in this regard are not correct for current imports and could potentially lead to enforcement action by CBP.

Please review your invoicing procedures for shipments of softwood lumber products from Canada and ensure the invoices for your shipments accurately describe the details of your transaction. Invoices for current shipments should not state that ADD/CVD deposits are included in the price, nor should they contain ADD/CVD case numbers or other information relating to the revoked ADD/CVD orders.
